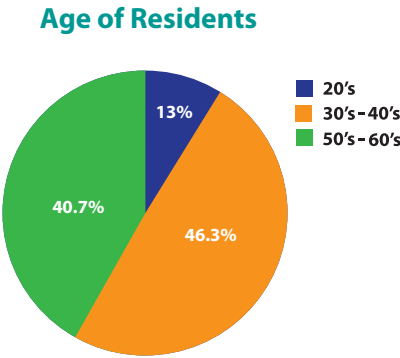

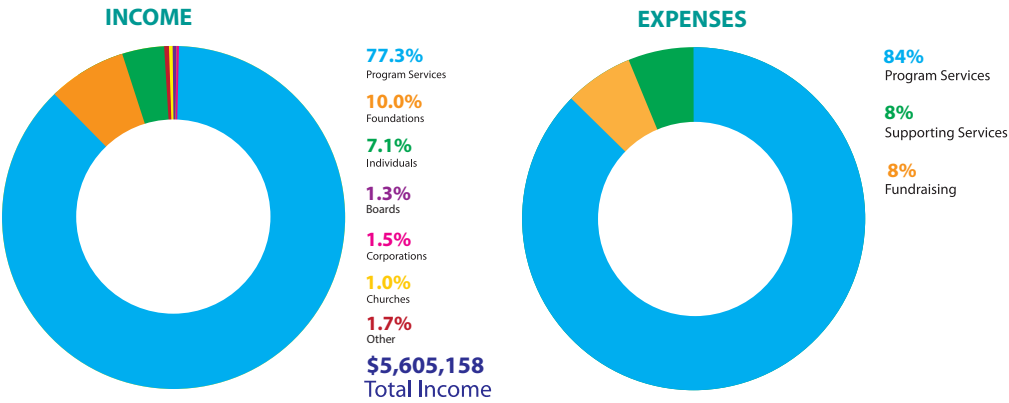

Her mother shared, “She really feels responsible for Adrienne.” Staff regularly witness Allison’s servant’s heart: stepping up without being asked to clear dishes, helping with jackets, and encouraging her friends to do their part.
